

## Lesson 4 God And Sin

### Lesson Outline

#### Bible Text JONAH 1 - 4

**Memory Verse** 1Timothy 2:3-4 This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

**Truth of God's Word** God wants everyone saved from sin.

### Lesson Segment (25 minutes)

#### Review Visual

Review the previous lesson  
Bible Text: GENESIS 6:1 – 7:24  
Memory Verse: Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Truth of God's Word: Sin always destroys.  
Living for God - Conclusion: When you received Jesus into your heart to become saved, you escaped being destroyed by sin and were freed from the last two types of death.

#### Use participation games

Introductory Question: What does God want for sinners?

#### Topic Visual

Introduce the lesson  
Bible Text: JONAH 1 - 4  
Memory Verse: 1Timothy 2:3-4 This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.  
Truth of God's Word: God wants everyone saved from sin.

### Bible Story Visual

Living for God - Bible Story: God wanted the people of Nineveh to be saved from their sins, so He sent Jonah to preach to them. Instead of Jonah going to Nineveh, he boarded a ship going in the opposite direction. Due to Jonah's disobedience, there was a great storm. To save the ship, Jonah asked to be thrown aboard, and a huge fish swallowed him. While inside the fish, Jonah repented. After God commanded the fish to vomit Jonah out, Jonah went to Nineveh. He preached to the people of Nineveh, they repented and God did not destroy them.

### Word in my Life Visual

Living for God - Life Application: God sent Jonah to preach to the people of Nineveh because he wanted them to repent from their sins.

2 Peter 3:9, 1Timothy 2:3-4, Ezekiel 18:23 - God is not pleased about anyone's sin but wants all to repent and be saved from sin. So God made provision for salvation by sending Jesus to die and rise again to save everyone including you from sin (Roman 5:6-8). By believing in Jesus, God is pleased that you are saved from sin just as He intended.

Living for God - Conclusion: When you received Jesus into your heart to become saved, you were saved from sin as God wanted.

Highlight for the Unsaved Child: God wants you to be saved from sin; therefore, you need to receive Jesus into your heart to become saved.
